

MONTHLY FIRE CHIEFS REPORT

Regular Meeting: October 17, 2023

Operations:

- We responded to 65 calls in September. Average response times district-wide was 8 min 32 seconds, which is about 2 minutes less than last month. The average for the year is 10:18.
- Average response times by station are as follows. Station 1-17:21, Station 2-16:05, Station 3-9:23, Station 4-9:50, Station 5-4:04, Station 6-5:42, Station 7-8:24, Station 8-11:51, Station 9-6:52
- Expect Tender 57 to be completed in the next 4-6 weeks.
- I hosted an in-district volunteer meeting, it went well. We have several takeaways to work on.

Wildland/Mitigation:

- Roadside chipping in Corona Heights went well. Chipping took just over 1 day: 24 properties participated, and 31 cubic yards were removed. This was less than half the material of Golden Gate.
- County Mitigation around the Justice Center is complete.
- County Mitigation around the Recreation Center is about 60% complete.
- Roadside Mitigation in Corona Heights will begin the first week of November.
- Hosted a meeting about the Corona Heights roadside work with County Manager Rears. 3 homeowners attended.
- Will begin burning with USFS in late December or early January.

Administration:

- We were awarded the DFPC "Direct Distribution Grant", award value is \$9,301. While small, everything helps. We will be replacing our wildland helmets, 25 structure hoods, and 10 pairs of structure boots.
- Roof grant was submitted. No news yet.
- Fire alarm at Station 7 should be complete.
- We are waiting on parts for the fire alarm system at Station 3.
- We had our ESO transition kick off meeting this morning.
- Our station lock system transition to cloud based is complete and everything is working much better.
- FRWRM grant submission for 4 year of mitigation coordinator at \$395,488 our match is 50% or \$197,724 over 4 years.
- Two additional members were brought on and added to most recent recruit class, one in-district and one shift

Training:

- October training subject is Structural Search and Rescue, focusing on rapid, effective search techniques as well as efficient victim movement/removal.
- Two students are challenging the State Hazmat test coming up this Friday morning.
- Four TFPD FFs enrolled in FF2 course w/ Golden, Golden Gate, and Black Hawk FDs, class begins 10/28.
