

MONTHLY FIRE CHIEFS REPORT

Regular Meeting: May 11, 2021

Operations:

- We responded to 48 calls in April.
- COVID Update:
 - Our current directives include fabric masks on all calls and N95 or P100 masks on ALL medical calls when closer than 20 feet to the patient.
 - o We continue to reevaluate our policies to limit our exposure if someone becomes sick.
 - o We currently do not have anyone out or in quarantine.
 - O We currently have adequate supplies of PPE with small amounts in reserve. Gilpin County has additional reserves, if needed.
 - O We are providing the support staff for the vaccine clinics. We are providing 3-4 members for each clinic. They are doing paperwork, directing people, assisting people to the site, etc. If the member chooses to be paid they will be paid by TFPD and we will be reimbursed through OEM via federal COVID funding.
- The 800 radio transition is going well. There has been a significant learning curve.

Wildland:

- Our in-house 130/190 (basic wildland firefighter) is will be complete next weekend after the overnight field day. This was a 40 hour class put on by our instructors. The class also had attendees from Golden Gate and Central City Fire.
- We plan to list Tender 57 available on May 31st.
- We plan to list a brush truck available late May.

Administration:

- Our summer picnic has been scheduled for July 17th. It will be held at Columbine Park in Dory Lakes at 2pm. Everyone is invited and welcome to bring friends and family.
- We continue to get lots of building and driveway pans for review. We are also in the process of
 working through a commercial permit for expansion of a storage facility in Rollinsville. This may
 open the conversation for repairing the cistern in the area.
- We are on track to complete 100% of our commercial building inspections this year. I don't think this has been done since 2012.
- I was hoping to have information on truck replacement for this meeting. I am still waiting for additional information.
